SYNOPSIS

Lonely college freshman Alex (writer/director Cooper Raiff) has closed himself off from his peers, who all appear to have this whole "college thing" figured out. But everything changes one night when Alex takes a leap and attends a party at Shithouse – a legendary party fraternity – where he forges a strong connection with Maggie (Dylan Gelula, FIRST GIRL I LOVED). The next day, she ignores him completely and seems to have forgotten about their amazing night. Desperately clinging to his social breakthrough, Alex pulls out all the stops with one more night at Shithouse, hoping to rekindle that moment of connection. From producer Jay Duplass, this Grand Jury Prize Winner at the 2020 SXSW Film Festival announces an hilarious and winning new star of American independent film.

Q&A WITH COOPER RAIFF

SHITHOUSE got the attention of Jay Duplass when you tweeted a link to an earlier version of the film at him. How did he help to get the project off the ground?

In every way. The most important way I think was just him being a great friend who also happened to know every answer to every question I had about making a movie. He's a very busy dad and husband and filmmaker, so I was always mindful of his time. But at one point he made it clear to me that I was a friend who he wanted to help and that was just really huge to hear. He's the most supportive person ever.

You wrote, directed, co-edited, and starred in the film. What was your experience like juggling all of these roles on-set?

It was crazy and I'd definitely rather not do it again. There's a reason those roles are usually one person's full-time job. Not just because it's difficult for a person to take on multiple roles, but also because it makes things difficult for everybody else. But, luckily, we had an incredibly talented, very patient cast and crew. To answer the question though, it was the most vulnerable experience of my life. On set I just had to pretend like I didn't write it. I pretended like the reason I knew it so well was just because I did my director homework. And when I was directing I would pretend like I wasn't acting in it. And when I was acting I would just launch myself into [my character] Alex's feelings.

How did you assemble your key crew?

Will Youmans is SHITHOUSE's MVP. He's a friend who produced SHITHOUSE with zero producing experience. He also filmed and acted in the original movie that Jay saw way back when. He's the best. Divi Crockett, our other producer, came on late but really saved the day. For DP, Jay asked [DP] Benjamin Kasulke for his favorite cinematographers and one of them was Rachel Klein. I sent her the script then we had an awesome phone call. She's insanely talented. We're also both from Dallas which is cool. Everybody else on the crew was either a friend of mine or somebody that Rachel and Divi had worked with previously.

The film has such an amazing ensemble cast; how were you involved in the casting process?

A lot of them were friends of mine. We didn't have a casting director so a lot of it was me texting friends "hey do you want to be in a movie I'm making?" For Maggie, I direct messaged Dylan [Gelula] on Instagram and mentioned the name Jay Duplass about fifteen times. After Dylan got on board, I begged her to direct message Logan on Instagram. For Mom, I begged Jay to ask Amy [Landecker] to read the script.

To what degree are you like your character Alex?

I had an awesome childhood and I missed home a lot when I got to college. Figuring out a second home was hard because my first home was so rock solid and dependent on my family members.

What is next on the pipeline for you?

I'm going to fly to Wales and beg Laurie Nunn to let me be a part of "Sex Education" in some way. I really want to keep writing and acting. In my backpack there are some episodes of this TV show idea I have called "Hal & Harper." I'd love to make that one day. There's also a movie I'm writing right now to fill my time. But what I want to do next is work on other people's projects.

CAST BIOS

Dylan Gelula (Maggie)

Dylan Gelula emerged in 2016 after her breakout performance in FIRST GIRL I LOVED, which won the NEXT Audience Award at the Sundance Film Festival. Her TV credits include Netflix's critically-acclaimed "Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt," where she played Jane Krakowski's stepdaughter Xanthippe, and recurring arcs on Hulu's Golden Globe-nominated show "Casual" and the Showtime series "Shameless." She can also be seen in Max Winkler's FLOWER, Andrew Bujalski's SUPPORT THE GIRLS, Alex Ross Perry's HER SMELL, and Jeff Baena's Netflix project, HORSE GIRL. Her next TV appearance will be in the FX drama "A Teacher," premiering this summer.

Cooper Raiff (Alex)

Cooper Raiff is a 23-year-old filmmaker/actor from Dallas, TX. He put together a movie with great friends and stolen equipment, and in a burst of bravery, tweeted the link to Jay Duplass. Raiff wrote, directed, edited, and starred in SHITHOUSE, his feature-length debut.

Amy Landecker (Mom)

Amy Landecker has captivated a wide array of audiences with a variety of impressive comedic and dramatic roles in both television and film. Amy is currently shooting "Your Honor" opposite Bryan Cranston for Showtime. She will also be seen in FX's new anthology series from B.J. Novak, "Platform". She previously starred in five seasons of the critically acclaimed Amazon original series "Transparent." On the film side, Amy will appear in the upcoming Netflix UNTITLED HENRY & REL SCI-FI PROJECT starring opposite Jaime Foxx and Joseph Gordon-Levitt. Other film credits include BOMBSHELL, A KID LIKE JAKE, BEATRIZ AT DINNER and the Coen Brother's A SERIOUS MAN.

Logan Miller (Sam)

Most recently, Logan Miller starred in the hit Sony feature film ESCAPE ROOM which grossed over 150MM worldwide; he also recently shot the sequel, ESCAPE ROOM 2, which will be released sometime in late 2020 or 2021. He also recently starred in the critically acclaimed Fox feature LOVE, SIMON alongside Nick Robinson, Jennifer Garner, Josh Duhamel & Katherine Langford. No stranger to independent film, Logan starred in Kelly Reichardt's NIGHT MOVES, the sci-fi thriller PLUS ONE, the drama DEEP POWDER opposite Shiloh Fernandez and Haley Bennet, IFC Films' THE STANFORD PRISON EXPERIMENT, and was the lead in writer/director Matt Sobel's feature debut TAKE ME TO THE RIVER. Logan's TV credits include roles in the hit AMC series "The Walking Dead," the "Veronica Mars" re-boot and he continues to voice the role of 'Sam' on the animated series "Ultimate Spider-Man." He also provided voice over for "The Guardians of the Galaxy" animated series in 2018.

Olivia Welch (Jess)

Rachel Klein is a Brooklyn based cinematographer from Bedford, Texas. She has shot in over 10 countries and shot celebrities such as Jessica Chastain, Heather Graham, Mira Nair and Julie Dash for the 2018 TIFF selected feature documentary THIS CHANGES EVERYTHING. She also has a short selected in this year's Tribeca Film Festival. SXSW's grand jury winner SHITHOUSE is her narrative feature debut. Rachel is a selected member of the female cinematographer's collective *CinematograpHERSXX* and represented by *Intrinsic LA* for her camera work and by the female run production company *SLMBR PRTY* for her documentary work.

Autumn Dea is a Philadelphia, PA area native and a graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University's School of the Arts. She received a BA in film with a double minor in media studies and psychology.
